AIMS and METHODOLOGIES

The main aim of the spring school is to enable students to build skills in creative problem-solving by working in interdisciplinary teams; preparing them for professional practice through immersive cross-disciplinary experiences: study visits, lectures, workshops, and debates.

Topics include theoretical and historical preview of European fortified landscapes with the focus on the heritage of the former Naval Fortress Pula; European best practices in sustainable reuse, local examples of successful revitalization and proposals for civil reuse of former military heritage.

Methodology will include common architectural processing techniques, project-based learning, lectures, study visits and model-making; collaborative working by using the living-lab approach and adaptive reuse proposals as well as development of new cultural tourism products such as local cultural routes connecting fortified and former military sites.

Students will improve their skills in identifying and understanding tangible and intangible cultural values. Consequently, they will be asked to develop design concepts for sustainable reuse, and revitalization of the fortified places, preserving the historical significance of places.



MAIN TOPIC

Defence system of the former Naval Fortress Pula in the broader context of European fortified landscapes and their sustainable reuse: 30 major fortifications in 3 rings around the Venetian castle and the historic Arsenal in the city port.

Pula's fortifications are today mostly unused (besides the Venetian Castle - Historical and Maritime Museum; Fort Verudela - Aquarium, Fort Bourguignon - Archaeological Museum of Istria) and located in the former military areas.

The focus of the study are the fortifications in the city port: on the St. Andrea Island in the centre of the city port, recently open for visits, in comparison with fortifications on the northern and southern part of the port and in tourist zones (Musil, Bourguignon, Verudela): study visits, group work and proposals for new functions and reuse for civil purposes.

OUTPUTS

Design studio's final outputs will be part of a public exhibition and presentation to the local community of Pula. Results will be published in a dedicated monograph edited by UNICAPress, Sharing Series.
